## Present perfect

#### Form

Positive: have / has + past participle form.

I have (I've) finished my work.

He has (He's) written three letters today.

**Negative:** have / has + not + past participle.

They haven't done the work this week.

The post hasn't arrived yet.

### Questions

Where has she been today?
