



- Use capital I. I'm your teacher. NOT i'm.
- you = singular and plural.
- · Use he for a man, she for a woman, and it for a thing.
- · Use they for people and things.
- In contractions '= a missing letter, e.g. 'm=am.
- · Use contractions in conversation.

- You can also contract are not and is not like this: You are not Italian. — You're not Italian.
 She is not Polish. — She's not Polish.
