



4C object pronouns: me, you, him, etc.

- · Object pronouns take the place of nouns. She meets John . She invites him to her house.
- · Object pronouns go after the verb. Hove you. NOT I you love.
- · You also use object pronouns after prepositions (with, to, from, etc.). Listen to me! I'm in love with her. NOT I'm in love with she.

4D possessive pronouns: mine, yours, etc.

Subject pronouns	Possessive adjectives	Possessive pronouns
I	It's my car.	It's mine.
you	It's your car.	It's yours.
he	It's his car.	It's his.
she	It's her car.	It's hers.
we	It's our car.	It's ours.
they	It's their car.	It's theirs.

- · Use possessive pronouns to talk about possession.
 - A Whose book is it? Is it yours?
 - B Yes, it's mine.
- · Use possessive pronouns in place of a possessive adjective + noun.

It's my car. OR It's mine.

A Don't use *the* with possessive pronouns. This is yours. NOT This is the yours.


